

Supporters to 'pound pavement' this week for last \$12,600 of Byron library fund

Rev. Nathan Godley, co-chairman with Mrs. Frances McDaniel of the fund-raising committee for a new public library in Byron, urges citizens to make their pledge this week; \$12,600 still needs to be raised locally to obtain a state grant for the 4,000 ft. planned library which will cost \$257,143. Twenty-five thousand dollars has been budgeted by the Peach County Commissioners; \$25,000 by the city of Byron, and \$23,114.00 has been pledged by businesses and members of the Byron community.

The Lions and Lionesses clubs, Jaycees and Jaycettes, Friends of the Library, Battle of Byron Recreation Committee, and the Pilot Club have all made generous pledges for the new library.

Members of the Village Green Garden Club, Jaycettes, and Friends of the Library have attempted to telephone all Peach County residents

north of Powersville, urging that pledge cards be returned. Mrs. Dot Williams is directing the effort to secure individual pledges.

Byron Mayor Larry Collins, Rev. Godley, Mrs. McDaniel and Building Chairman Tommy Alden are calling upon local businesses to ask for their contributions.

Rev. Godley states, "We're going to make our goal. We must! The library

needs are growing with the growth of the community. Send in your pledge today.

"The people of Byron will always come through when there's a real need. We'll pound the pavement to secure the balance of the money if we have to," concluded Mrs. McDaniel, who is an enthusiastic supporter of the new library and of the city of Byron.
